It was so great to see many of our families last Tuesday at our back to school picnic. Thank you Allison for organizing! PHCP is blessed to have such an awesome Parent Group! Fall is a fun time of year. The children will be learning about pumpkins, spiders, bats, bones, community helpers and fire safety. We have had several fire, tornado and lock down drills. They all did a great job moving quietly and quickly.

We will begin chapel this week in the Fellowship Hall. Our first bible story the children will learn about is Creation. They will learn that everything God created is good and we are created in the image of God. Our first fruit of the spirit is love. This month they will be introduced to the sign language for love and joy. Each class will have a bible box and they will collect items throughout the year to remind them of each story. Each week your child will bring home a chapel handout, please talk to them about what they have learned.

Reading aloud to children is the most important activity you can do to help your child develop the skills needed to be successful in reading, school and life. Children are never too young to be read to. By age two or three, children begin to develop an awareness of printed letters and words. Reading to your children also helps them to see the relationship between sound and print. It helps increase their vocabulary and learn about their world. Reading different types of books and reading often will help make reading an enjoyable experience. Some of the different types of books you can read to your child are alphabet, counting, concept, wordless and books with repetition or patterns. Talk about the pictures and ask them questions. The best way for children to learn to listen is by listening to them.

We will be passing out Operation Christmas Child boxes this month. You may return them to the preschool any time before November 19. Our goal is to reach as many children as possible so they can hear the good news about Jesus and receive a bible in their language. Please prayerfully consider helping with this mission.
